#### The Readiness Programme was Launched in May 2014

#### Goal:

- ✓ Increase resilience through **concrete adaptation** projects & programmes
- ✓ Focus on most vulnerable countries and communities

#### • Specific objectives:

- To increase the preparedness of applicant national implementing entities seeking accreditation by the Adaptation Fund
- ii. To increase the number of high quality project/programme proposals submitted to the Board within a reasonable time period after accreditation

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#### **South-South Cooperation Grants Programme**

- Countries without an NIE may apply for a grant to receive support from an existing NIE
- Support in one or more of the following:
  - identifying potential NIE candidates;
  - assisting NIE candidates in the preparation of applications to be submitted to the Fund;
  - providing support and advice during the application process.
- Countries being supported during this first phase:
  - Cabo Verde, Chad, Niger
  - Burundi





# Phase II: Readiness Programme Activities (Approved April 2015)

Support to accredited Implementing Entities (AF introduction seminar, peer-to-peer learning, ESP, Project Formulation assistance)

Cooperation/ Partnership with Climate Finance Readiness Providers (Community of practice and training, support country level M&E, joint seminars)



Support to countries seeking accreditation (south-south grants, seminars on climate readiness, tools and guidance documents)

#### Lesson: Support for direct access readiness is needed

- AF launched a readiness programme in May 2014 to complement other initiatives – Phase II has been approved in April 2015
- Common challenges:
  - Selection of an appropriate entity for accreditation (due diligence when reviewing existing institutional capacity)
  - Understanding of and competence in fiduciary standards
  - Human resource constraints
  - Sometimes experience limited to handling smaller projects
- Those building countries' readiness should be up-to-date
- South-South cooperation should be encouraged



### **Phase II Progress**

#### Metamorphosis of core activities into 4 main components

### 1. Support to accredited IEs

- TA grants to 6 NIEs (US\$ 118,000)
- Peer-peer learning
  - ✓ (<u>DC Seminar:</u> July 2015. 17 out of 19 NIEs + RIEs, MIEs and practitioners of climate finance). Second climate finance readiness seminar for NIEs offered an opportunity for entities to gain familiarity with the environmental and social policy and build capacity in managing and addressing environmental and social risks in project design and implementation.
  - ✓ <u>Climate finance readiness workshop</u>: September 2015 in Abuja, Nigeria and co-hosted by the Heinrich Böll Stiftung (HBS) and the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS).
  - ✓ <u>Climate finance webinar #1</u>: 19 November 2015. NIEs participated in the webinar to discuss the topic of community engagement and stakeholder consultation in climate adaptation projects and programmes.
  - ✓ <u>COP 21 side event</u>: 4 NIEs (Fundecooperacion Costa Rica; MCT Micronesia; NABARD India; and SANBI South Africa) discussed their experiences with direct access, and shared success stories and lessons learned from the accreditation process as well as preparation of climate change adaptation project proposals and implementation of approved projects on the ground.

### 3. Support to countries seeking accreditation

- S-S cooperation grants to 5 countries through 2 NIEs (US\$ 242,347)
- Climate finance readiness seminars

### 4. Knowledge management

- 4 NIE adaptation stories published
- Climate Finance Ready microsite
- Contribution to secretariat KM strategy



### **Programme Performance/Achievements**

### Increased NIE/RIE accreditation

- 7 complete applications for accreditation in the current fiscal year (commencing 1 July 2015).
- By the end of FY16 (30 June 2016), 4 new NIEs and 2 RIEs cumulative to receive accreditation
- Cumulative increase of 9 IEs (7 NIEs + 2 RIEs) accredited since launch (excludes MIEs).
- 8 endorsements for new DAs
- 1 additional RIE nominated by the DA but for which application is yet to be submitted.
- 1 NIE re-accredited and 2 more have submitted applications for re-accreditation which are currently under review.

### Programme Performance cont'd...

### Increased NIE project proposals

- Growth rate of 25%/annum in number of project proposals submitted by NIEs since launch of readiness programme, numbers having increased from 11 in 2014 to 18 by year end of 2015.
- 21 project proposals submitted for AFB.26, 10 from NIEs.
- 21 project proposals submitted for AFB.27, 7 from NIEs.

### Increased partnerships built

- Additional partnerships in co-hosting and organizing readiness seminars include the Development Bank of Latin America (CAF), and the National Environment Authority of Panama (ANAM),
- Additional partners who have invited the secretariat and the Fund's IEs to their events, include the GEF, the IADB, the Nature Conservancy, GIZ, CI, the UNFCCC secretariat, CIF, the GCF, and the World Bank's Climate Change Group
- community of practice of NIEs, RIEs and individual experts that participate in seminars, side events, workshops and other events established. Roster of experts on environmental and social policy available on Fund's website.

### Programme Performance cont'd...

# Increased visibility and thought leadership positioning

- Readiness programme has helped increase the visibility of the Fund, and positioned it as a thought leader in climate finance readiness.
- Informal requests received for information on its experiences with project development and pre-accreditation work with countries from other funds e.g. GCF, and from regional bodies such as COMESA.

- Recognition by the CMP at COP 21. Decision 1/CMP.11;
  - ✓ notes the approval of Phase II and the approval of South–South cooperation grants to 4 countries totalling US\$ 244,447; and
  - ✓ notes the efforts of the Adaptation Fund Board secretariat to organize workshops for NIEs
