The Readiness Programme was Launched in May 2014

Goal:

✓ To increase the number of accredited national implementing entities (NIEs), and strengthen the overall capacity of NIEs

Specific objectives:

- To increase the preparedness of applicant national implementing entities seeking accreditation by the Adaptation Fund
- ii. To increase the number of high quality project/programme proposals submitted to the Board within a reasonable time period after accreditation

Phase I and II: Readiness Programme Activities

Convening actors working on direct access (accreditation, project development, capacity building)

Designing improved materials on AF processes



Developing a knowledge exchange platform

Phase II: Readiness Programme Activities (Approved April 2015)

Support to accredited Implementing Entities (AF introduction seminar, peer-to-peer learning, ESP, Project Formulation assistance)

South-South Cooperation Grants Programme

- Countries without an NIE may apply for a grant to receive support from an existing NIE
- Support in one or more of the following:
 - identifying potential NIE candidates;
 - assisting NIE candidates in the preparation of applications to be submitted to the Fund;
 - providing support and advice during the application process.
- Countries being supported during this first phase:
 - Cabo Verde, Chad, Niger
 - Burundi





Metamorphosis of core activities into 4 main components

1. Support to accredited IEs

- TA grants to 6 NIEs (US\$ 118,000) 2 in Latin America
 - ❖ TA for ESP and Gender 25k
 - ❖ TA for Gender 10k
 - Project Formulation Assistance (PFA) 15k

Peer-peer learning

- COP 21 side event: 4 NIEs (Fundecooperacion Costa Rica; MCT Micronesia; NABARD India; and SANBI South Africa) discussed their experiences with direct access, and shared success stories and lessons learned from the accreditation process as well as preparation of climate change adaptation project proposals and implementation of approved projects on the ground.
- Climate finance readiness seminar for national implementing entities: Annual event in Washington DC. 2016 Dates are 13-15 July.
- Climate finance readiness workshop to be held in Mumbai, India and co-hosted by NABARD and UNEP, 23-25 Aug and Rabbat, Morocco, 6-8 Sept 2016.
- Climate finance webinar #2: held on 28 April, NIEs discussed the topic of knowledge management. Next webinar 26 October 2016.



Programme Performance/Achievements

Increased NIE/RIE accreditation

- Cumulative increase of 9 IEs (7 NIEs + 2 RIEs) accredited since launch (excludes MIEs).
- Endorsements for new DAs in 8 countries
- 1 NIE re-accredited and 2 more have submitted applications for re-accreditation which are currently under review.

Increased NIE project proposals

- 21 project proposals submitted for AFB.26, 10 from NIEs.
- 21 project proposals submitted for AFB.27, 7 from NIEs.
- LAC: 14 currently approved concrete projects across 13 countries and another five endorsed projects that aren't yet fully developed

Programme Performance cont'd...

Increased partnerships built

- Co-hosting and organizing readiness seminars includes the Development Bank of Latin America (CAF), and the National Environment Authority of Panama (ANAM),
- Additional partners who have invited the secretariat and the Fund's IEs to their events, include the GEF, the IADB, the Nature Conservancy, GIZ, CI, the UNFCCC secretariat, CIF, the GCF, and the World Bank's Climate Change Group
- Roster of experts on environmental and social policy available on Fund's website.



Programme Performance cont'd...

Increased visibility and thought leadership positioning

- Readiness programme has helped increase the visibility of the Fund, and positioned it as a thought leader in climate finance readiness.
- Informal requests received for information on its experiences with project development and pre-accreditation work with countries from other funds e.g. GCF, and from regional bodies such as COMESA.

Acknowledgement by CMP through Decision 1/CMP.11

- Recognition by the CMP at COP 21. Decision 1/CMP.11;
 - ✓ notes the approval of Phase II and the approval of South–South cooperation grants to 4 countries totalling US\$ 244,447; and
 - ✓ notes the efforts of the Adaptation Fund Board secretariat to organize workshops for NIEs



Lesson: Readiness support is needed

Common challenges:

- Selection of an appropriate entity for accreditation (due diligence when reviewing existing institutional capacity)
- Understanding of and competence in fiduciary standards
- Lack of appropriate documentation of certain operations or policies
- Human resource constraints
- Sometimes experience limited to handling smaller projects
- Those building countries' readiness should be up-to-date
- South-South cooperation and peer to peer learning should be encouraged
