Implementing entities and the secretariat discuss the development of a community of practice for continued dialogue and exchange of information, resources and interaction with experts. The dialogue will be guided by the following structure:

- 1. Background to the idea of the community of practice and process to date
- 2. What is the purpose/objective of the community of practice?
- 3. What should the community of practice look like e.g. group email platform, web based platform like C4Dev, other?
- 4. How would it work? Here issues to consider are roles and responsibilities e.g. between the secretariat and participants. Need to emphasize the need for commitment by participants to keep the platform "alive"/active.
- 5. What tools can be used to support knowledge learning and exchange on the platform e.g. sharing videos, case studies, documents etc?
- 6. What are the General Rules/code of conduct for engaging on the platform?
- 7. Immediate actions for operationalizing the community of practice.

Clinics on the Fund's project cycle, environmental and social policy and gender policy, reaccreditation and accreditation workflow, readiness small grants. Clinics include short video interviews with select NIEs.

Representatives of accredited NIEs and RIEs are invited to attend the clinics. In the clinics, participants will have the opportunity to interact one-on-one with secretariat staff and environmental and social safeguards experts to ask questions and gain a clear understanding on project proposal requirements. Clinics will also include one-on-ones with secretariat staff on the re-accreditation process and requirements as well as Q&A for readiness small grants. In parallel with the clinics, representatives are invited to have short video interviews on their AF project experience/plans. The interview themes may cover: a) concrete adaptation benefits your country will get as a result of AF project, b) relevance of the project in the life of ordinary people and vulnerable communities, and c) experience of direct access project implementation compared to the conventional financing model.
