### The Readiness Programme was Launched in May 2014

#### Goal:

✓ To increase the number of accredited national implementing entities (NIEs), and strengthen the overall capacity of NIEs

#### Specific objectives:

- To increase the preparedness of applicant national implementing entities seeking accreditation by the Adaptation Fund
- ii. To increase the number of high quality project/programme proposals submitted to the Board within a reasonable time period after accreditation



Institutionalized by the Board in April 2016 (Decision B.27/38)


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



# South-South (S-S) Cooperation Grants

- Component 3 of Readiness Programme: Countries without an NIE may apply for a grant to receive support from an existing NIE (up to 50k)
- Support in one or more of the following:
  - identifying potential NIE candidates;
  - assisting NIE candidates in the preparation of applications to be submitted to the Fund;
  - providing support and advice during the application process.
- Expected Benefits:
  - Can speed up the accreditation process
  - Instills confidence in the applicant
  - Responds to common challenges
    - Selection of an appropriate entity for accreditation (due diligence versiewing existing institutional capacity)
    - Understanding of and competence in fiduciary standards



## **Technical Assistance (TA) Grants**

- To help strengthen the capacity of national and regional implementing entities to receive and manage climate financing
- Strengthen capacity in the areas of environmental, social and gender risk management
  - ❖ TA Grant for ESP and Gender 25k (All accredited NIEs)
  - ❖ TA Grant for \*Gender 10k (Previous ESP grant recipients only)
- Support in one or more of the following:
  - Developing procedures/manuals/guidelines for screening projects/\*avoid, minimize, mitigate adverse gender impacts;
  - Developing procedures/manuals/guidelines for undertaking risk assessments/\*undertaking gender assessments;
  - Developing Policies/avenues for public disclosure and consultation
  - Training of staff/\*for gender mainstreaming

### **Project Formulation Assistance (PFA) Grants**

- Project Formulation Grants (PFGs) available to build capacity in project preparation and design.
- PFA available for undertaking of specialist technical assessments.
- Can apply at concept stage only
  - Up to 20k maximum per NIE
- Support any of the following assessments:
  - Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA)
  - Vulnerability Assessment (VA)
  - Risk Assessment
  - Other Environmental and Social Assessments for adaptation projects
