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Knowledge Management Systems for Climate Adaptation

What kind of KM systems are in place?; experience putting them together/maintaining them.

- There has been growing awareness / appreciation of the need to integrate KM.
- KM systems operate within the wider framework of Institute's policy guidelines
 - PIOJ has business process manual; communication policy/guidelines
- The role of the NIE in KM is to (a) compile data/generate lessons learnt during implementation phase of the programme cycle, and (b) to share the information with relevant stakeholders (locally and globally)
- Currently, a tiered system of KM exists:
 - Between the NIE and EE/MDAs
 - NIE and target communities/direct beneficiaries
 - NIE and wider public

- Risk Atlas; Land Husbandry Manual; brochures, fact sheets; project videos/stories; PPR; Mid-Term Evaluation Reports
- Identification of which products to produce:
 - Products should have relevance to their target audience;
 - NIE has to be responsive to stakeholders, therefore, different focus for different groups (eg. Youth brochure vs. corporate brochure)
 - Utilize existing technology: eg videos to capture /disseminate achievements and on-the-ground happenings.





Knowledge Management Systems

- Storage and Access of Information
- Central documentation centre (library)
- Storage media and Reports/documents (PMU access)
- Website
- Improve visibility and communication with stakeholders
 - Roll-out of Strategy and Action Plan





Knowledge Management Systems

- Sharing KM Information: How and to Whom?
 Diverse range of stakeholders
- Internally intranet; central documentation centre (library); Programme Management Unit
- Inter-agency PSC meetings; PMG; EE and Partners
 - Share information as well as physical distribution
- Media Engagement (JIS Think Tank; outside broadcasts, etc.)
- Generally public (website; reporting to donor; participation in seminars, webinars, partner events)
