REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF PROJECT COMPLETION DATE: UNITED NATIONS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME (UZBEKISTAN)

Background

- 1. The Adaptation Fund Board (the Board) at its twenty-second/twenty-third intersessional meeting, approved a six-year project titled "Developing climate resilience of farming communities in the drought prone parts of Uzbekistan", submitted by the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) for a requested amount of US\$ 5,415,103 (decision B. 22-23/6). The overall goal of the project is to develop climate resilience in farming and pastoral communities in the drought-prone Karakalpakstan region of Uzbekistan. The project develops institutional and technical capacity for drought management and early warning, establish climate resilient farming practices on subsistence dekhkan farms, effect landscape level adaptation measures for soil conservation and moisture retention, and widely foster knowledge of climate resilient agricultural and pastoral production systems in arid lands. The project will improve climate resilience of more than an estimated 1,000,000 ha of land.
- 2. As mandated by the decision, an agreement was prepared and signed between the Board and UNDP.
- 3. The first tranche of disbursement for the implementation of the project was released following signature of the agreement in March 2014. The first project performance report (PPR) for the project was submitted in March 2015 and cleared by the Adaptation Fund Board Secretariat (the secretariat) in September 2015. The second PPR was submitted in July 2017 and was cleared by the secretariat in August 2017, and the third PPR was submitted in October 2018 and was cleared in January 2019. In addition, the project underwent a mid-term evaluation (MTE) which was completed in March 2018. As of May 2019, a total amount of US\$ 3,925,914 had been disbursed to the project by the trustee, corresponding to 72.5% of the project funding.
- 4. This is the first request for an extension of the project completion date. As outlined in the Adaptation Fund Project/Programme Delay Policy (AFB/B.29-30/3/Rev.1) amended by the Board in October 2017 (Decision B.29-30/15), a request for an extension of project completion date must be submitted by the implementing entity at least six months prior to the official completion date. UNDP had submitted such request through the secretariat on 8 April, hence in compliance with the Policy, for an extension of the completion date until 30 November 2021 (Annex 1).
- 5. The reasons for this request for an extension of project completion date, as outlined by UNDP, include the fact that:
 - The project registered delays in the operational commencement of project activities, due
 to the late appointment of the National Project Coordinator and the signing of the project
 document by UNDP and the Government;
 - The second tranche of funding was received late, affecting some of the planned activities which were postponed to 2016-2017; and
 - In 2016 occurred a comprehensive reform process, due to the change in the country's leadership, which included the reorganization of the executing entity (Uzhydromet), the reorganization of farming, subsistent pastoralists and household plots. The project had, therefore, to adapt its implementation to these reforms to enhance its impact on the ground in the pilot region (Karakalpakstan).
- 6. The request includes a project budget balance for 2019-2021 (Annex II), and a three-year work plan and budget (Annex III).

Secretariat's review of the request

- 7. Following a review of the request, the secretariat finds that given the explanation provided by UNDP, following the MTE and Project Steering Committee recommendations, this request of an eighteenth-month extension is justified. The extension of the project completion date will allow to complete all the planned activities and also to ensure sustainability of the projects' results, strengthening at the same time their scaling-up potential. It is also noted, that the proposed budget revision at outcome level does not constitute a material change and does not alter the project management costs.
- 8. Finally, the secretariat acknowledges that this no-cost project extension request has been agreed with the Executing Entity and the Designated Authority has been notified, in accordance with the Adaptation Fund Policy for Project/Programme Delays, as specified in Annex 1.

Recommendation

9. Therefore, the Board may consider and decide to approve the request for an eighteenthmonth extension of the project completion date from 31 May 2020 to 30 November 2021 for the project "Developing Climate Resilience of Farming Communities in the Drought Prone Parts of Uzbekistan" as requested by UNDP.

Reasons/justifications for the extension of project/programme completion:

The extension is requested to compensate for the following delays and circumstances that the project faced during its launch and implementation: i) 4 months required for the operational start of project activities following the approval of the project by the AF Secretariat in February 2014; ii) implementation gaps/delays between the funding tranches; iii) delays/adjustments brought forward by changes in the Government policies and the national context.

- Following the approval of the project by the AF in February 2014, corresponding agreement between the AF and UNDP was signed in March 2014. However, national approval of the project, including the appointment of the National Project Coordinator and the signing of the Project Document by UNDP and the Government (Uzhydromet) took place only in May 2014.
- 2. In 2015, the project faced a significant delay with receiving of the 2nd tranche of funding. It was received on 28 September 2015, i.e. 6 months after the submission of the PPR (31 March 2015) to the AF Secretariat. Given the very season-dependant nature of adaptation activities/outputs, this affected the project delivery and achieving of its targets as the implementation of some key activities (procurement of required equipment and implementation of best adaptation practices and approaches) were postponed to 2016-2017.
- In 2016, due to the change in the country's leadership, comprehensive reform process in the country was launched by the new President, including adjustments to national policy, finance, economic and institutional systems. These included the devaluation of national currency, reorganization of farming, subsistent pastoralists and household plots, institutional changes in the Government including the reorganization of the national partner agency (Uzhydromet) under the Ministry of Emergency Situations. The given reform process necessitated the project to be responsive to changes and emerging opportunities that envisaged some deviations from the initially planned project implementation milestones and deadlines. To adapt to these reforms and changes in the country, as per the decision of the project board, the project implementation and management was revised accordingly to enhance its implementation capacity on the ground in Karakalpakstan (project pilot region). Moreover in 2018, with substantial support of UNDP Country Office, the project team succeeded in the procurement 83 units of agro, water and resource-saving machinery and equipment (amounted to USD 795,000) for the implementation of best adaptation practices by farming, subsistent pastoralists, 10 established cooperatives of rural households as well as operation of Extension Services Centers in Karakalpakstan. However, the achievement of corresponding outputs, i.e. adaptation benefits, requires much time than that is currently remaining as per the Project Document, i.e. until 31 May 2020.

Therefore, 18 months extension is being requested as it is expected to provide the project with sufficient time to complete all the planned activities and ensure the sustainability of the project results through greater uptake and ownership by the project beneficiaries and partners as well as establish a sound ground for their scaling-up across the country. This is the first and only extension request for the project. The need for an extension has been recommended within the MTR done in 2018, discussed and agreed with the UNDP Regional Office/RBEC. It has been also considered during the 5th meeting of the Project Board and endorsed through its decision. The requested extension for the period of 18 months will allow for successful finalization of the project, including its meaningful terminal evaluation. Requested extension will not cause any increase in the Project Management Costs, and it remains within the allowable limit as per the financial regulations of the AF.
