## **REPORT ON ACTIVITIES OF THE CHAIR**

2. During the United Nations Secretary General's Climate Action Summit in New York City in September, three contributions or pledges to the Adaptation Fund were announced. We are very grateful for the pledges from Sweden, Spain and first-time Fund contributor Government of Quebec totaling more than US\$ 58 million announced at the Summit and hope they will carry added momentum into COP25. Sweden's pledge of about US\$ 53 million will be distributed over four years.
