REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF PROJECT COMPLETION DATE: UNITED NATIONS ENVIRONMENT PROGRAMME (CAMBODIA)

Background

- 1. The Adaptation Fund Board (the Board) at its eighteenth meeting, approved a five-year project titled "Enhancing Climate Resilience of Rural Communities Living in Protected Areas of Cambodia", submitted by the submitted by the United Nations Environment Programme (UN Environment) for a request amount of US\$ 4,954,273 (decision B.18/11).
- 2. The overall goal of the project is to address the vulnerability of rural communities living in selected protected areas (CPA's) in Cambodia to the climate change-induced hazard of erratic rainfall which is reducing food supplies as a result of an increased frequency of droughts and loss of topsoil during intense rainfall events and flooding. The project is comprised of three main components, namely: i) develop protocols for eco-agriculture interventions; ii) concrete eco-agriculture adaptation interventions; and iii) institutional capacity, awareness raising and upscaling of eco-agriculture interventions. As mandated by the decision, an agreement was prepared and signed between the Board and UN Environment.
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- 4. The first tranche of disbursement for the implementation of the programme was released following signature of the agreement in July 2012. The first programme performance report (PPR) for the project was submitted in March 2013 and cleared by the Adaptation Fund Board Secretariat (the secretariat) in April. The second, third, fourth and fifth PPRs were cleared by the secretariat in April 2015, February 2016, November 2016, May 2018 and November 2018 respectively. The sixth PPR has been received in October 2019 and is currently under review by the secretariat.
- 5. As of October 2019, a total amount of US\$ 4,954,273 had been disbursed to the project by the trustee, corresponding to 100% of the project funding.
- 6. The expected completion date of the project, following decision B.31-32/3, is 1 December 2019. UN Environment has submitted, through the secretariat on 25 September 2019, a request to extend the project completion date until 31 May 2020 (Annex 1) and a revised work plan for 2019-2020 (Annex 2). This is the second request for an extension for this project. As outlined in the Adaptation Fund Project/Programme Delay Policy (AFB/B.29-30/3/Rev.1) amended by the Board in October 2017 (Decision B.29-30/15), a request for an extension of the programme completion date must be submitted by the implementing entity at least six months prior to the official completion date. However, such request was received at a date beyond the deadline afore-mentioned.
- 7. The reasons for this request for an extension of project completion date, as outlined by UN Environment, include the fact that the project experienced administrative delays which have caused the project to fall behind on its revised workplan and spending targets. Moreover, a delay in the procurement of two consultants, hired to develop a project upscaling strategy and a document on policy revisions to relevant strategies and policies to integrate climate change adaptation and the ecoagriculture approach, has caused a deferral in their assignments completion.

Secretariat's review of the request

- 8. Following a review of the request, the secretariat finds that given the explanation provided by UN Environment, this request of a six-month extension is justified. Further, it should be highlighted that the project has always been rated as satisfactory in the annual project performance reports submitted, and the last PPR received a rating of highly satisfactory, as the project has achieved all its set targets and was able to extend its interventions to reduce the vulnerability of an additional 20 communities. This extension will, therefore, ensure that the benefits of the project are reflected in national policy documents, and knowledge products that will promote the upscaling of eco-agriculture across Cambodia and that the project will be able to finalize its final evaluation and reporting requirements.
- 9. Finally, the secretariat acknowledges that this no-cost project extension request has been agreed with the Executing Entity and the Designated Authority has been notified, in accordance with the Adaptation Fund Policy for Project/Programme Delays, as specified in Annex 1.

Recommendation

10. Therefore, the Board may consider and decide to approve the request for a six-month extension of the project completion date from 1 December 2019 to 31 May 2020 for the project "Enhancing Climate Resilience of Rural Communities Living in Protected Areas of Cambodia" as requested by UN Environment.

Reasons/justifications for the extension of project/programme completion:

- In June 2018, the project was granted a no-cost extension until December 2019 to extend selected, successful interventions – namely construction of small-scale water supply infrastructure (wells) and introduction of multi-use trees into home gardens – beyond its agreed targets to reduce the vulnerability of an additional 20 communities (CPA's). In addition, the extension would allow the project to complete institutional strengthening and awarenessraising activities planned under Component 3, which would ensure that the benefits of the projects approach are reflected in national policy documents that will promote upscaling of eco-agriculture across Cambodia.
- While the project has been able to extend many of its interventions, it has unfortunately experienced a few administrative delays during the course of 2019 that have caused the project to fall behind on its revised workplan and spending targets. In particular, a minor discrepancy (<\$30) between the annual audit and expenditure reports has delayed disbursement of the final tranche of money to the project, which has slowed the implementation of final on-the-ground activities. Furthermore, delays in procurement of two consultants to i) develop an upscaling and ii) propose policy revisions, has meant that they have yet to complete their assignments.</p>
- A no-cost extension until 31 May 2020 is therefore requested to enable the project to complete
 all of its planned activities. The extension will also ensure that the project is able to finalise all
 of its terminal monitoring and reporting.
- Evidenced by its ratings in the PPRs, MTR and during the visit by AF staff, the project has
 achieved multiple successes and has been able to exceed many of its initial targets.
 Therefore, we think it will be valuable to allow the project additional time to conduct final
 monitoring, generate reports on lessons learned/best practice, and convert these into policy
 briefs and knowledge products. This further supports the request for a 6-month no-cost
 extension.
