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MTS LEARNING AND SHARING PILLAR

The MTS Learning and Sharing Pillar has a specific objective: to support learning and sharing about adaptation finance and action

Three Expected Results (ERs)

ER 1: Lessons learnt and shared. Practical lessons from Fund processes and projects/programmes captured and effectively communicated to adaptation actors around the world;

ER 2: Knowledge and guidance developed. Under this practical knowledge gained, and guidance provided vis-à-vis select themes (e.g. improving the durability of adaptation actions; integrating traditional knowledge, the knowledge of indigenous peoples and local knowledge systems into adaptation actions; and the role of adaptive management in project implementation);

ER 3: Analytical capacity strengthened. Long-term analytical/learning capacity strengthened in developing country Parties.



The main objectives:

- a. Transferring knowledge from one NIE to another;
- a. Transferring knowledge from NIEs to the wider climate finance adaptation community;

b. Developing knowledge and guidelines through partnerships

Sub objectives

- Encourage a <u>culture of learning across institutions</u> and build NIE capacities
- Capture, study and disseminate practical lessons additional to KM activities financed under AF approved projects/ programmes;
- Complement <u>collaborative knowledge</u> and sharing efforts with respect to partnerships with diverse stakeholders;
- Study successful climate change adaptation actions (thematic or sectoral) and disseminate knowledge gained to enable robust interventions;
- > Share knowledge gained at the institutional level with the climate change networks at the <u>national</u>, regional and international level

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Sub objectives

- Enable the <u>production of baseline studies</u> that could be leveraged for <u>replication and up-scaling purposes</u>;
- > Serve as an important feedback loop to guide future interventions (e.g. studies, publications, research material);
- Play an enabling role by <u>capturing</u>, <u>disseminating</u> and <u>communicating</u> <u>knowledge</u> to a diverse set of adaptation actors <u>locally</u> and <u>globally</u>;
- Leverage South-South learning by providing a <u>platform for NIEs to exchange knowledge and best practices</u> and <u>find solutions</u> to shared challenges;
- Develop knowledge products as well as setting up a knowledge management system



Eligibility criteria:

- ➢ Be a National Implementing Entity of the Adaptation Fund and have an accreditation status of "Accredited";
- ➤ Have an Adaptation Fund funded project that has reached the midpoint in implementation or where a Mid-Term review or Evaluation has been submitted;
- Submit together with the application form, a letter endorsed by the Designated Authority to the AF in support of the learning grant application;

Size: up to US\$150,000 per project; US\$400,000 per year, at least 10 grants



ELIGIBLE ACTIVITIES

They should fall under the 3 categories stated in the Implementation Plan of the MTS, namely: transferring knowledge from one NIE to another; transferring knowledge from NIE to the wider climate adaptation community developing knowledge and guidelines through partnerships

➤ **Activities**: Lessons learned, studies & publications, technical guidance briefs, partnerships, knowledge management platforms/systems, adaptation financing workshops, resource centers, knowledge sharing events, country exchanges and learning courses

List is non-exhausting and further activities could be added



HOW TO APPLY?

- Learning Grants can be presented by accredited NIEs twice a year in preparation for the Board meetings
- The next submission deadline can be found in our events calendar of the AF website
- Your proposal should include: a) a signed letter of endorsement by the Designated Authority (DA) and b) a grant proposal (refer to the template at "Application Form, Learning Grant" in the Knowledge & Learning section under "Call for Learning Grants"), including a certification by the Implementing Entity

IMPLEMENTATION ARRANGEMENTS

- NIEs to submit applications on application template following launch of the learning grants by secretariat
- ➤ Secretariat to assess fulfilment of the requirements to access the learning grants using the established review criteria and undertake a technical assessment of the submitted proposals using the project review template.
- Following technical review, secretariat to submit proposals to the PPRC for their review and recommendation to the Board
- Accredited NIEs to be responsible for managing the grants and implementation of the project, including all aspects of procurement, financial and non-financial reporting
- ➤ NIEs to submit project monitoring and completion reports and financial reports, similar to reports currently in place for the Readiness grants
