
Medium-Term Strategy (MTS): Approved in October 2017

Action Pillar

• **Objective:** Support eligible countries to undertake high quality adaptation projects and programmes consistent with their priority needs, goals and strategies

Expected Result (ER) 3

• Effective action scaled up. Countries readied to scale-up effective projects/ programmes with support from other climate funds and finance channels (including private sector)



Planning for maximizing impacts and scaling-up

Potential for scaling up at design stage

Design the project with the objective and flexibility to reach scale

Analyze the opportunities and constraints, both at project-level and context-level

Innovation

New approaches, techniques, instruments (i.e Weather index-based insurance) and technologies (seeds, digital finance etc.) Institutional and implementation arrangements

Ensure clear focus of the project and avoid complex designs, e.g. Christmas tree

Flexible arrangements (procurement, disbursement) for smooth implementation

Partnership for resource mobilization

Systematically identify cofinancing opportunities for greater impact

Identify partnership opportunities at design and during supervision to achieve scaling-up ambitions

Sustainability

Sustainability of assets and processes

Ownership is key (local and government)

Working with local partners and the private sector to strengthen sustainability

Project scale-up grants under the Readiness Programme

Available to NIEs up to US\$100,000 per project

Support evidence-based approach to scaling-up (planning, assessment, capacity enhancement, stakeholder consultation, public and private partnerships, etc)

NIEs with tangible achievements on their project/programme

Project near completion (2PPRs, MTE or PCR)

Endorsement by Designated Authority of the scale-up grant application

Identification of potential source of funding to scale up the proposed project



Eligibility criteria



To increase the readiness of accredited national implementing entities (NIEs) to expand or replicate concrete Adaptation Fund funded adaptation activities that are based on country needs, views and priorities, in order to reach more people and/or broaden project/programme effectiveness

Mandatory requirements



- Must be an accredited national implementing entity of the Adaptation Fund and have an accreditation status of "Accredited".
- Must submit together with the application form detailing information on the proposed activities, a letter of endorsement by the Designated Authority to the Adaptation fund in support of the scale-up grant application.
- Must have identified a potential source, or sources, where the entity could seek funding to scale up the proposed project/programme.

Submitting the grant application

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Request for assistance to design and develop scaling-up pathway for Adaptation Fund projects/programmes

The application template should be completed and transmitted to the Adaptation Fund Board Secretariat by email or fax.

The overall goal of project scale-up grants is to increase the readiness of accredited national implementing entities (NIEs) to expand' or replicate' quality projects that are based on country needs, views and priorities, in order to reach more people and/or broaden project/programme effectiveness to help vulnerable communities in developing countries adapt to the adverse effects of climate change.

Take note! Key elements of the proposal

BACKGROUND

- Provide context including project status
- Outline results/achievements of project identified for scale-up
- State any non-AF funding that was used in project

GOAL OF THE PROPOSED SCALE-UP

- explain main objective for wanting to scale-up the project/programme
- provide a clear description of the benefits to vulnerable communities

EXPECTED OUTPUT

- To be presented to a source of funding outside of AF
- state the source(s) of funding where the output will be submitted, and state engagement already done with potential funders

IDENTIFY PROJECT COMPONENTS TO BE SCALED-UP

- Explain how these components will be scaled up
- Outline any information from MTE/PPR/PCR that would improve the components

PROVIDE SCALE-UP RATIONALE/JUSTIFICATION

- Describe how the scaled-up activities will enhance climate resilience further to the current or completed project/programme
- Should be evidence-based including reference to any recommendations from MTE/PCR etc

Identifying sources of funding

- List potential sources e.g., other financing institutions; agreements under discussion by the NIE
- State any on-going discussions with funders and the outcome from completed discussions

Budget arrangements



 Submitted budget <u>Must</u> not exceed US\$100,000 per project



 Budget can include an Implementing Entity
 Management Fee ≤ 8.5% of the total project or programme budget before the fee



Budget can include an explanation and a breakdown of the Execution Costs $\leq 9.5\%$ of the total project/programme budget (including the fee)where relevant


