Background: For the second session of the 35th Adaptation Fund Board meeting, there is one innovation small grant proposal, that was previously submitted during the intersessional period between the first and second sessions of the thirty-fifth meeting of the Board and ultimately deferred to the second session of the thirty-fifth meeting of the Board as per decision B.35.a-35.b/71. The decision also encouraged the Government of Antigua and Barbuda to submit through DOE supplementary information addressing the issues raised under subparagraph b), which included: i) The revised small grant innovation proposal should further strengthen the innovation rationale of the proposed interventions within the respective legal and economic context; ii) The proposal needs to strengthen the cost-effectiveness justification of the chosen interventions, inter alia through the consideration of alternative technologies. The report contained in document AFB/PPRC.26.b/14 presents a summary of the proposal.

Action expected: The PPRC will be invited to take note of the report on the initial review of the proposals contained in document AFB/PPRC.26.b/14 and to make recommendations to the Board if necessary.

Background: This document presents the Adaptation Fund Programme on Innovation: Large Grants for Innovation, as per the Medium Term Strategy that was adopted by the Adaptation Fund Board (the Board) in its thirtieth meeting which refers to support via grants of up to \$5 million. 1.

Background: The report of the *Ad Interim* meeting of the PPRC that took place in August 2020, during the intersessional period between the first and the second sessions of the thirty-fifth meeting of the Board captured a request by the PPRC to the secretariat to prepare a paper to clarify the issues related to innovation and adaptation for the next meeting to facilitate the PPRC deliberations on this matter.

Action expected: The PPRC will be invited to take note of the report on Innovation: Large grants for innovation contained in document AFB/PPRC.26.b/17 and to make recommendations to the Board if necessary.

10. Window for enhanced direct access under the Medium-term Strategy

Background: The Fund pioneered enhanced direct access (EDA) when the Adaptation Fund Board (the Board) approved at its twenty-fourth meeting two regular sized projects for Costa Rica and South Africa through decisions B.24/8 and B. 24/15, respectively. The projects were unique in that they were the first to put into practice an implementation in which decision-making on the programming of climate finance would be devolved further downstream at the national and subnational levels, beyond the Fund's direct access model. In EDA, national and subnational mechanisms can be used to make decisions on which projects will be funded at the local level.

At its thirty-first meeting, the Board approved the implementation plan for the Medium-Term Strategy (MTS) and included new funding windows that could be opened under the MTS in complement of the Fund's existing funding windows. Having recognized that there was a high level of interest among the Fund's stakeholders to implement EDA, a specific funding window on EDA was included in the MTS implementation plan to complement the Fund's existing funding window for single-country projects.

Document AFB/PPRC.26.b/18 responds to Board decision B.31/32 and proposes a pilot window for EDA projects and programmes under the Fund. It outlines the

objectives, review criteria, review process and implementation modalities based on the Fund's experience with current approved EDA projects and lessons learnt by other stakeholders involved with EDA. It also proposes establishing the funding envelope for the pilot based on the projected annual funding for the window on EDA of US\$20 million per year for five years, which the Board had already approved in the Fund's MTS implementation plan¹.

Action expected: The secretariat will present document AFB/PPRC.26.b/18. The PPRC may want to discuss the document and suggested recommendations, and make recommendations to the Board on the way forward.
