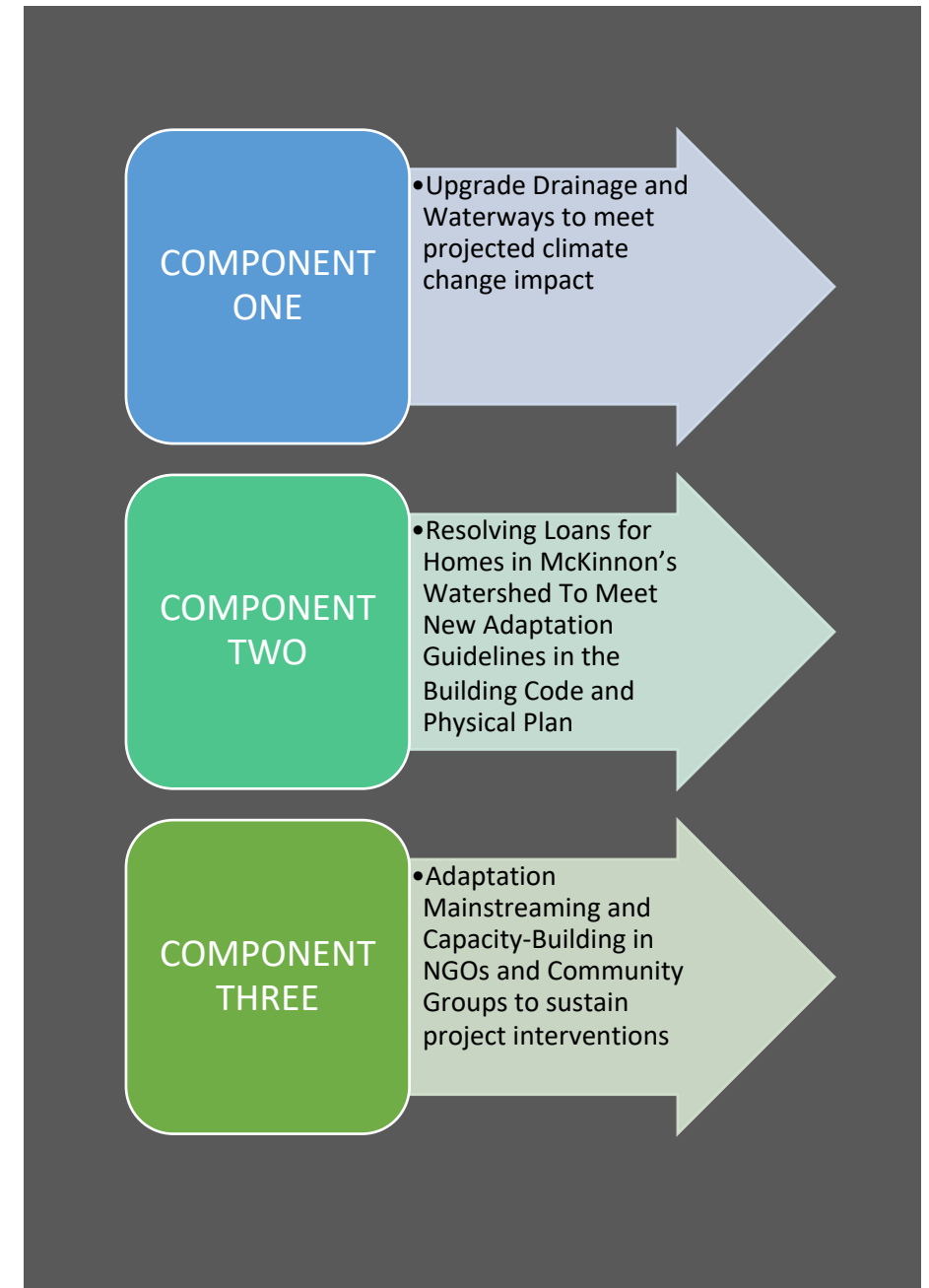

- Strengthened documentation of operational practices

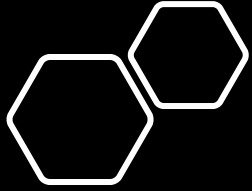
PROJECT MANAGEMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION

ENVIRONMENTAL SOCIAL SAFEGUARD AND GENDER CAPACITY

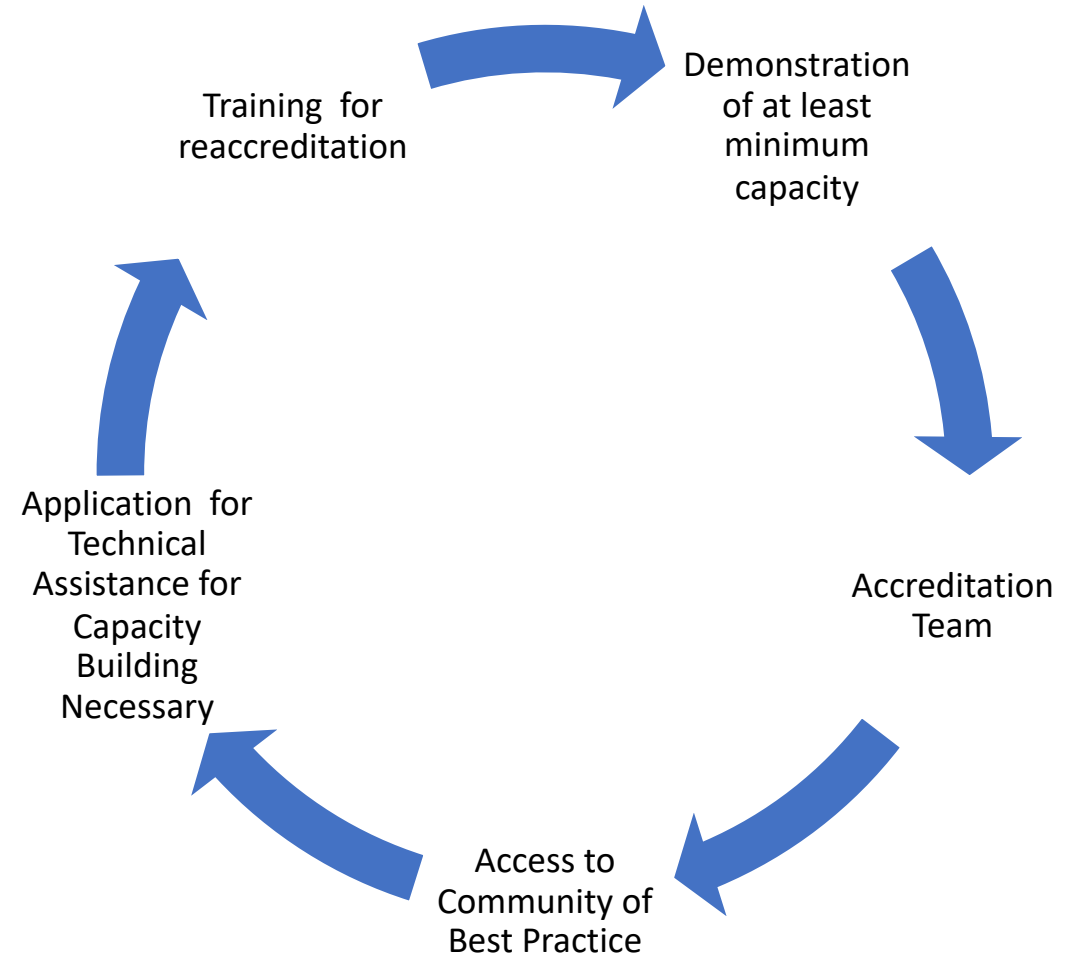
- Approved ESS and Gender Policies

Through enhanced institutional capacity and the accreditation to the AF, the Department accreditation to the Green Climate Fund was fast-tracked and approved in 2017



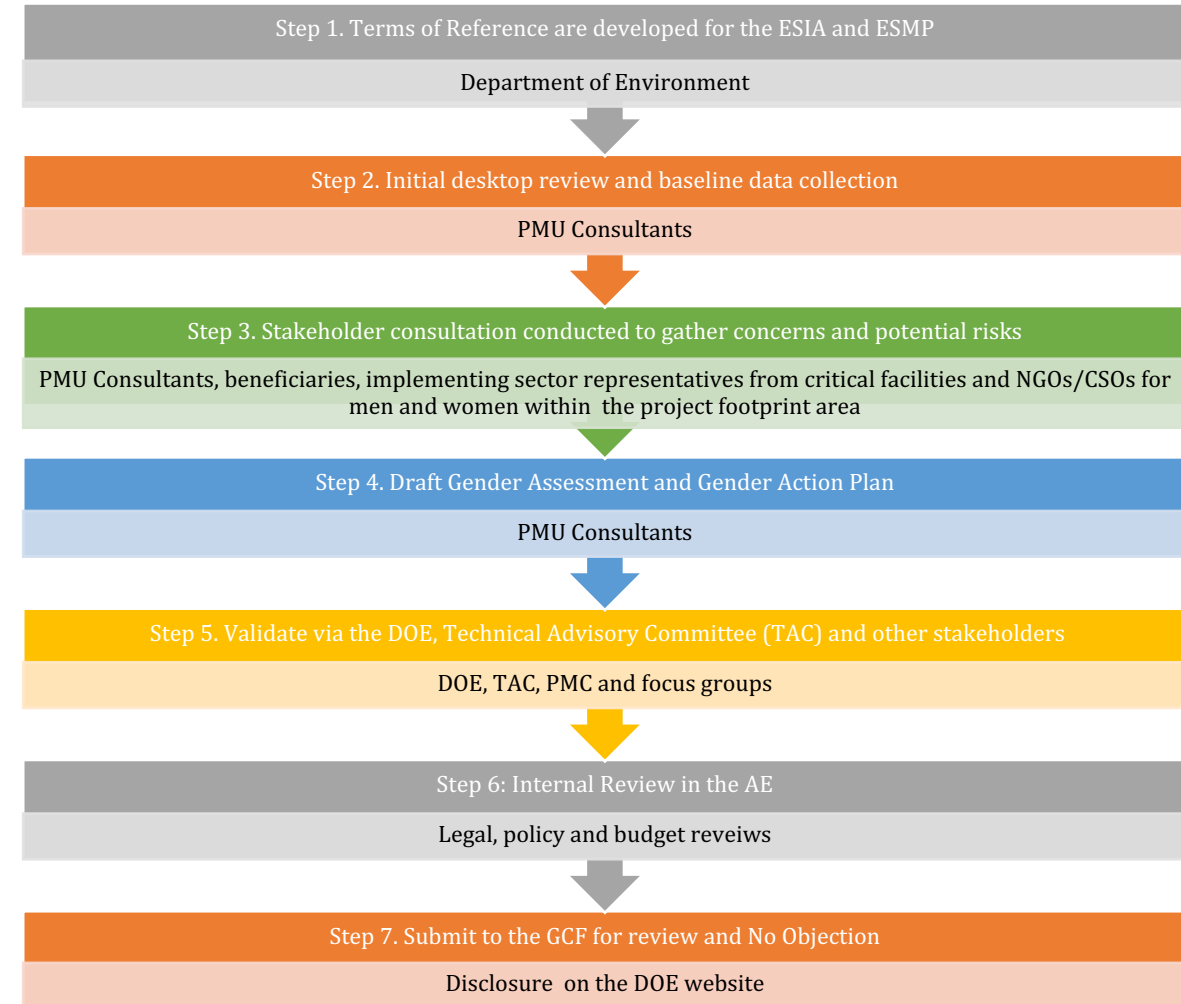

CASE STUDY: “Resilience To Hurricanes in the Building Sector in Antigua and Barbuda”

The project titled “Resilience To Hurricanes, Floods and Droughts in the Building Sector in Antigua and Barbuda” was approved by the Green Climate Fund at its B26 Board meeting. Antigua would have received over USD 30 Million in grant funding – Antigua and Barbuda received the largest amount in funding as a country for this project.
