REPORT ON ACTIVITIES OF THE CHAIR

1. During the intersessional period between the second session of the thirty-fifth meeting and the thirty-sixth meeting of the Adaptation Fund Board (both virtually held), the Chair, Mr. Ibila Djibril (Benin, Africa) carried out the below-listed activities for the Fund.

- (a) Finalized the report of the second session of the thirty-fifth meeting, assisted by the secretariat;
- (b) Liaised with and provided guidance to the secretariat on planning of work after the second session of the thirty-fifth meeting, including:
 - The Fund endorsing the principles of Locally-led Adaptation championed by the Global Commission on Adaptation at the Climate Adaptation Summit in January 2021;
 - Re-channeling the contribution by the European Commission to Adaptation Fund Climate Innovation Accelerator;
 - Completing the recruitment process of a new Chair for the Technical Evaluation Reference Group (AF-TERG);
- (c) In cooperation with the secretariat, signed project agreements through DocuSign to overcome the challenges under the COVID-19 pandemic;
