REPORT ON ACTIVITIES OF THE CHAIR

- 1. During the intersessional period between the thirty-sixth meeting and the thirty-seventh meetings of the Adaptation Fund Board (the Board) (both virtually held), the Chair, Mr. Mattias Broman (Sweden, Annex I Parties) carried out the below-listed activities for the Fund.
 - (a) Finalized the report of the thirty-sixth meeting, assisted by the secretariat;
 - (b) Liaised with and provided guidance to the secretariat on planning of work after the thirty-sixth meeting, including:
 - Resource mobilization initiatives under the resource mobilization action plan;
 - Fiduciary issues related to the United Nations Development Programme;
 - Joint statement by climate funds on responses to COVID-19 recovery;
 - Survey on enhancing civil society engagement;
 - Report of the Board to the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol (CMP) at its sixteenth session, and to the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement (CMA) at its third session, and preparations for developing its addendum;
 - Preparations for attendance at the Glasgow Climate Change Conference (COP 26), and contributor dialogue to be organized there;
 - Preparations for organization of the thirty-seventh Board meeting in virtual format, due to continuing restrictions on travel and meetings, as well as its agenda and particularly:
 - i. Election of officers for the period of office starting from March 2022;
 - ii. Launching discussion on the possible development of a new Medium-term Strategy to succeed the current one that continues until 2022;
