



The Adaptation Fund (AF) finances concrete projects that help vulnerable communities in developing countries adapt and build resilience to the effects of climate change while providing flexible, innovative finance modalities such

as pioneering Direct Access to build country ownership in adaptation and additional emerging funding windows across its pillars of Action, Innovation, Learning and Sharing. The AF creates tangible, positive results on

the ground, focusing on adaptation and strengthening capacity in developing countries with tailored, country-led approaches. The AF has demonstrated its effectiveness, efficiency and relevance as a global financial mechanism.

## Key achievements of the Adaptation Fund

- ✓ **Raised a record US\$ 356 million in new pledges last year** – triple the amount it raised in 2020 and nearly triple its fundraising US\$120M goal – across a record 17 different donors recognizing the Fund's effective work on the ground for climate-vulnerable countries, as well as high-demand. This followed record fundraising achieved in 2018 (US\$ 129M) and 2017 (US\$ 93M), as well.
- ✓ **Launching new Medium-term strategy (MTS) 2023-2027** to build on the successes and further enhance the previous MTS 2018-2022 with the Fund's strategic updates and adjustments in the context of an evolving adaptation finance landscape. It will continue to build on Fund's niche of Action, Innovation and Learning & Sharing, with added cross-cutting windows in locally-led adaptation and project scale-up. The previous MTS that was launched in 2018 was aimed at empowering the most vulnerable, advancing gender equality, strengthening capacity and building complementarity. It launched 7 new funding windows to respond to the climate crisis, including new windows in project scale-up, innovation, learning, and enhanced direct access. This received high marks from the Fund's independent Technical Evaluation Reference Group for its effectiveness and response to the urgency of climate change.
- ✓ **139 concrete adaptation projects on the ground approved to date**, benefiting the most vulnerable communities to climate change. Projects are serving 11 direct or 38 million total beneficiaries, including both direct and indirect beneficiaries. The Fund is active in 101 developing countries, with nearly half in LDCs or SIDS;
- ✓ **Serves the Paris Agreement as of Jan 1, 2019**, following a decision at COP24, which recognizes the important role of the Fund in climate finance. AF also continues to serve the Kyoto Protocol. Long term institutional arrangements solidified at COP25 to help ensure AF continues to serve Paris Agreement smoothly;
- ✓ **Delivering and Adapting During COVID-19** Versatile, and flexible, tailored and locally led climate change adaptation responses with inherent adaptation measures in projects also helping vulnerable communities build broader resilience against environmental, health and economic risks; this approach has allowed projects to further adapt directly to help with the COVID-19 crisis; first climate fund to approve new projects during pandemic through a virtual decision-making process and offered added online trainings, webinars and case studies;
- ✓ **Operationalization of direct access to climate finance**, allowing national institutions to take on the implementation role typically undertaken by UN organizations and MDBs. Throughout the accreditation process, national entities build and enhance local capacity. The Direct Access model, pioneered by the AF, has proven replication value for other climate financing organizations, such as the Green Climate Fund (GCF). AF has accredited 34 NIEs to date, and built a growing community of practice where countries share lessons and experiences in adaptation. AF has also accredited a total of 57 implementing entities;
- ✓ **Doubling Fund's cap on single country projects** from US\$ 10 million to US\$ 20 million and enabling countries to nominate and accredit up to two national implementing entities (NIEs) per country under the Fund's pioneering Direct Access modality;
- ✓ **Relevance, efficiency and effectiveness** of AF projects and programmes validated with high marks by the second phase of the independent evaluation of the Fund in June 2018;
- ✓ **Implementation of Readiness Programme** for Climate Finance to build countries' capacities to access funding and develop projects for climate adaptation through regional and global knowledge sharing workshops, field visits and webinars, grants for technical assistance and South-South cooperation. 55 readiness grants approved to date;
- ✓ **Strong, transparent safeguards** in adaptation projects and principles that promote human rights and gender equality while protecting marginalized groups and natural habitats;
- ✓ **Proven ability to ensure an accelerated, simplified, efficient and effective project cycle** combined with orientation towards results and performance-based measurements;
- ✓ **Committed to supporting the community of practice for direct access entities (CPDAE)** which seeks to enhance the capacities of direct access entities accredited to the AF and GCF to navigate the project life cycles of the two funds and to effectively programme climate finance through concrete projects and programmes, and enhance synergy between funds;
- ✓ **Fast-track Adaptation Fund accreditation process** approved in 2018 for implementing entities that have already been accredited by the GCF. A similar process exists for AF entities to be fast-tracked by GCF. There are similar processes in place for fast track reaccreditation;
- ✓ **Funding window for regional projects and programmes** incorporated as a standing part of the Fund's operations to enable adaptation projects that cross borders. 20 projects approved to date;
- ✓ **Active civil society involvement at various levels**, such as allowing comments on proposals under consideration, monitoring during implementation, and participation in Board meetings;
- ✓ **Piloting replicable and scalable concrete adaptation projects** that lead to other climate finance opportunities. At least 20 projects have been scaled up to date with funding from other sources.
- ✓ **Continue to innovate new finance mechanisms**. Streamlined accreditation opens doors for smaller entities from SIDS and other small nations.
- ✓ **The Adaptation Fund Climate Innovation Accelerator (AFCIA) programme offers innovation grants to vulnerable countries** through a wider range of stakeholders, including local governments, NGOs, young entrepreneurs, the private sector and others. AF also offers small and large innovation grants to its implementing partners.
- ✓ **AF has become a thought leader in adaptation**, institutionalizing its reservoir of knowledge from its projects and programmes since its launch 15 years ago. Its knowledge management programme regularly develops and disseminates case studies and publications on timely themes in adaptation, including recently on youth engagement and locally led action.

## The Paris Agreement and the Adaptation Fund

The Paris Agreement includes adaptation as a key component of the global response to climate change, and the Adaptation Fund is contributing to the objectives of the Agreement through its concrete projects and pioneering Direct Access modality that builds country ownership in adaptation. Moreover, the decision taken by the first meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement (CMA) recognizes that the AF should formally serve the Agreement. Following a decision by Kyoto member Parties during COP23 that AF should formally serve the Agreement, during COP24, the CMA decided the Fund shall serve the Paris Agreement, starting from January 1st, 2019. The new market mechanisms of the Paris Agreement also provide an opportunity to utilize the Fund's experience on monetizing carbon assets. To date, the AF has raised US\$ 211.93 million through carbon markets – a system that is fully operational.

The Paris Agreement promotes human rights by acknowledging climate change should be addressed in a way that respects vulnerable populations and gender equality. The AF has stayed ahead of this curve, adopting a policy in 2013 that ensures any projects supported by the Fund must promote positive environmental and social benefits, including respecting human rights, gender equality and vulnerable groups, something that has been specifically acknowledged, among others, by the United Nations Special Rapporteur on human rights and the environment. AF further streamlined equal access across all Fund programmes and resources among women and men in March 2016 by approving a gender policy and action plan and has continued to update these progressive risk management policies.


# Briefing Note

## The Adaptation Fund portfolio of concrete adaptation projects and programmes

The AF has transferred about 63.8 per cent of total committed funds to recipient countries. In total, US\$ 998 million has been allocated for climate adaptation projects/programmes, project formulation activities, South-South cooperation package grants for accreditation support and environmental and social policy technical assistance grants, in a total of 101 countries with the majority of projects now in the implementation stage (see Annex II).



Currently 57 implementing entities are accredited to the AF of which 34 are National Implementing Entities in Africa, Latin America and the Caribbean, and Asia-Pacific that have direct access to adaptation financing. About half of the National Implementing Entities are in Small Island Developing States (SIDS) or Least Developed Countries (LDCs), reflecting the Fund's focus on the most vulnerable. So far, 27 NIEs have received funding. The AFB and its secretariat actively collaborate with other climate funds, such as the Green Climate Fund, and share lessons learned from the unique experience of 15 years implementing direct access to climate finance.

## An opportunity to channel finance to effective adaptation to climate change

The AF is one of the most innovative and unique climate funds, and has achieved impressive progress in just a few years. The AF has proven its effectiveness as a highly efficient and transparent framework for directly channeling adaptation finance to developing countries. It is the only climate adaptation fund that includes the most vulnerable communities as a strategic priority.

The original source of revenue for the Fund – the sale of Certified Emission Reductions (CERs) accrued through a two per cent levy on Clean Development Mechanism projects – has drastically diminished due to market forces. The Board has continued to attract funds through developed country donations, by delivering concrete, effective, and localized projects and

continuing to innovate through pioneering programmes like Direct Access, Enhanced Direct Access, flexible finance modalities, social and environmental risk management policies and gender action plans. The Fund also developed an alternative streamlined accreditation process to open doors to climate finance for smaller countries and organizations, and further has in place an innovative funding window for regional projects and programmes for multiple countries facing climate change issues that cross borders, in addition to offering new project scale-up, learning and innovation grants.

The Adaptation Fund's climate response is growing, as the AF continued to help climate-vulnerable developing countries adapt to climate change over the years, and build broader resilience to the COVID-19 pandemic. In response to the climate urgency and to further serve the Paris Agreement, it expanded its funding windows beyond its traditional concrete projects to offer additional adaptation programmes to countries in project scale-up, innovation, learning and Enhanced Direct Access. Its Board also doubled the amount of funding countries can access for single-country concrete projects, and doubled the number of national implementing entities countries can have under its pioneering Direct Access modality to further expand country ownership and capacity in adaptation. In the wake of the peak of the pandemic, the Fund continues to deliver offering additional funding windows to vulnerable countries, and responding to the urgency of climate change.

## Annex I: Implementing Entities of the Adaptation Fund

### Accessing Resources from the Adaptation Fund

Potential implementing entities are evaluated by independent experts of the Accreditation Panel for compliance with the AF's fiduciary standards and requirements of the AF environmental, social and gender policy. Implementing entities can be national, regional or multilateral. There are currently 14 accredited multilateral implementing entities, 9 regional implementing entities and 34 national implementing entities of which 16 (47 per cent) come from either LDCs or SIDS. All developing country Parties to the Kyoto Protocol and/or Paris Agreement are eligible to submit up to two entities for accreditation. Accredited implementing entities can apply for funding of up to US\$ 20 million per country for concrete single-country adaptation projects or programmes. Multiple countries can also submit collaborative regional proposals up to US\$ 14 million through implementing entities.
