WORK PLAN FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023

Background

- 1. At its thirty-seventh meeting, the Adaptation Fund Board (the Board) approved the work plan for the fiscal year 2022 (FY22: 1 July 2021 30 June 2022). The present document summarizes the actions and decisions taken by the Board in the period from 1 July 2021 to the date of issuance of this document (the reporting period) in compliance with the approved work plan for FY22. During the period covered, the Board convened at its thirty-seventh meeting, which took place on 19-21 October 2021 virtually. This document presents a proposed work plan for FY23, prepared by the secretariat and in accordance with the mandate that the Board received from the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol (CMP), and from the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement (CMA) and as well as decisions adopted by the Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (COP) and the Board, for consideration by the Ethics and Finance Committee (EFC).
- 2. The work plan for the next fiscal year is generally presented at the last Board meeting of the fiscal year. The proposed work plan for FY23 is therefore being presented to the EFC for recommendation and subsequently to the Board for approval at its thirty-eighth meeting to be held on 7-8 April 2022.

Compliance with work plan for FY22

- 3. During FY22 and as of the date of issuance of this document the Board has fulfilled the following functions mandated by the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol (CMP) in decisions 1/CMP.3 and 1/CMP.4:
 - The Board has accredited one national implementing entity (NIE) and one Regional Implementing Entity (RIE). This puts the total number of entities accredited to the Fund at 56, comprising of 34 NIEs, eight RIEs and 14 MIEs. The Board also re-accredited three implementing entities: two NIEs and one RIE, thereby increasing the number of reaccredited entities in the Fund's portfolio to 33.
 - The Board has approved altogether six projects/programmes for funding for a total amount of US\$ 57.2 million, which included four single-country projects totalling US\$ 31.3 million and two regional projects totalling US\$ 25.9 million. The Board has also endorsed six project concepts, including four single-country concepts and two regional concepts, as well as endorsed two regional pre-concepts. The Board has also approved project formulation grants totalling US\$ 250,000. The total amount of funds disbursed during the reporting period is US\$ 57.9 million including other small grants.
 - One virtual portfolio monitoring mission took place from 30 November to 2 December 2021 to collect and analyse lessons learned and best practices from the project "Ecosystem Based Adaptation to Climate Change in Seychelles" implemented by the United Nations

Development Programme. A report of the virtual portfolio monitoring mission was developed and is to be added as information document for the 38th Board meeting.

- The United Nations Climate Change Conference in Glasgow, the United Kingdom, took place from 31 October to 13 November 2021, and COP 26 / CMP 16 / CMA 3 made decisions related to the Adaptation Fund, including CMP 16 decisions on the fourth review of the Adaptation, on Adaptation Fund Board Report for 2020 and 2021, on guidance relating to the Clean Development Mechanism; CMA 3 decisions on matters relating to the Adaptation Fund, on guidance on cooperative approaches referred to in Article 6, paragraph 2 of the Paris Agreement, on rules, modalities and procedures for the mechanism established by Article 6, paragraph 4 of the Paris Agreement, and on enhancing climate technology development and transfer to support implementation of the Paris Agreement; and COP 26 / CMA 3 Decision on the Glasgow Climate Pact. The decisions are elaborated in detail in document AFB/B.38/10.
- The Board welcomed the financial pledges and contributions to the Adaptation Fund made by the Governments of Canada, European Union, Finland, Germany, Ireland, Norway, Qatar, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, the United Kingdom, the United States of America, the Brussels-Capital, Flanders, and Walloon regions of Belgium, and Quebec, Canada, totalling equivalent to nearly USD 349 million.
- 4. The following actions derived from Board decisions and included in the work plan for FY22 were also completed during the reporting period (from July 2021 to the date of issuance of this document):
 - The Board completed the intersessional review cycle in July 2021.
 - The Board and secretariat completed the first regular project and programme review cycle for decisions for FY22 between August to October 2021. The second review cycle is ongoing from January to April 2022 and the third intersessional review cycle will follow from April to July 2022.
 - The Board and secretariat organized the thirty-seventh meeting of the Adaptation Fund Board on 19-20 October 2021 in a virtual format.
 - The secretariat supported the thirty-sixth and thirty-seventh meetings of the Accreditation Panel which took place on 1-2 September 2021 and 2 February 2022 in a virtual format.
 - The secretariat issued the annual performance report (APR) for the fiscal year 2021. A user-friendly graphic version of the report was produced and translated in French and Spanish.
 - The secretariat held the eighth annual Climate Finance Readiness Seminar for accredited NIEs of the Fund on 3-5 August 2021, third country exchange visit in India on 17, 19 and 24 August 2021, Workshop on Accreditation and Re-accreditation on 9 September 2021,

Workshop on Innovation in Adaptation on 22-23 November 2021 and Climate Finance Readiness Webinar on 9 December 2021 on Enhancing Access to Climate Finance under the new Funding Windows, which were all in a virtual format.

- The Board, at the thirty-seventh meeting, approved one small grant on innovation and one learning grant to NIEs.
- The Board, during the intersessional period between its thirty-seventh meeting and the thirty-eighth meeting, received two applications for the readiness package grant from NIEs.
- The Board, with the support of the secretariat, continued its ongoing discussion on linkages between the Fund and the Green Climate Fund.
- The Board, at thirty-seventh meeting, amended the Fund's Operational Policies and Guidelines for Parties to Access Resources of the Adaptation Fund to reflect the Board decision (B.36/42) related to the accreditation of up to two national implementing entities for country for eligible developing-country parties.
- The updated Gender Policy and Action Plan prepared through a multi-step and participatory approach including the public call for comments was approved by the Board in March 2021. The secretariat completed a study on intersectional approaches to gender mainstreaming in adaptation-relevant interventions, which was submitted intersessionally to the Board as an informational document (document AFB/B.37-38/Inf.1).
- Following Board decision B.37/38, the secretariat organized, during January March 2022 an open online survey and three expert roundtables to inform the development of the new Medium-term Strategy for 2023-2027.
- The secretariat prepared a draft resource mobilization strategy and action plan.
- The secretariat published in March 2022 a knowledge product "Lessons Learned from the continuous process of capacity strengthening of Implementing Entities through reaccreditation to the Adaptation Fund".

Proposal of work plan for FY23

5. Based on the above, the secretariat presents to the EFC the secretariat proposed workplan for FY23. The routine activities of the Board are not included in the workplan. Other actions can be added as a result of the decisions adopted by the Board at this meeting.

Recommendation

- 6. The EFC may wish to consider and recommend that the Board:
 - a) Approve the secretariat's proposed work plan for FY23, as contained in Annex I of AFB/EFC.29/4.
