REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF PROJECT COMPLETION DATE: AGENCE POUR LE DEVELOPPEMENT AGRICOLE (MOROCCO)

Background

- 1. The Adaptation Fund Board (the Board) at its twenty-fifth meeting, approved a four- and half-year project titled "Climate changes adaptation project in oasis zones PACC-ZO", submitted by the Agence pour le Developpement Agricole (ADA) for a requested amount of US\$9,970,000 (decision B. 25/13)
- 2. The objective of the project is to help reduce the vulnerability of people and oasis agro ecosystems in Morocco to climate change by increasing the adaptive capacity of local actors, increasing the resilience of the target ecosystem and by disseminating knowledge management.
- 3. The project includes five main components: i) Improving adaptive capacities of the water sector; ii) Diversifying income sources and improving the living conditions of populations vulnerable to climate change in the targeted areas; iii) Improving the ecosystems' resilience in response to climate change and variability; iv) Improving stakeholder awareness though the management and exchange of knowledge and v) Strengthening the capacities of participants in the design and implementation of adaptation measures.
- 4. As mandated by the decision, an agreement was prepared and signed between the Board and ADA in July 2015 and the project starts its implementation on 14 December 2015.
- 5. On 29 July 2020, ADA had submitted a request for extension of the project completion date from 14 December 2020 to 14 June 2022 in compliance with the Adaptation Fund Project/Programme Delay Policy (AFB/B.29-30/3/Rev.1 and Decision B.29-30/15). The Board through its decision B.35.a-35.b/77 approved the request for an eighteen-month extension of the project completion date until 14 June 2022.
- 6. As of May 2022, a total amount of U\$ 9,648,637 had been disbursed to the project by the trustee, corresponding to 97% of the project funding. In addition, the project has submitted its fourth project performance report (PPR) in March 2022 which was cleared by the Adaptation Fund Secretariat in April 2022, and the fifth and last PPR is expected during the second quarter of 2023. The project went through a mid-term evaluation (MTE) process, with the MTE report was finalized in May 2020.
- 7. Considering the further delays experienced by the project since the last extension of completion date and additional challenges created by the ongoing pandemic of COVID19, the entity has submitted a second no-cost extension request (Annex 1), postponing the project completion date from 14 June 2022 to 14 December 2023.
- 8. As outlined in the Adaptation Fund Project/Programme Delay Policy, a request for an extension of the project/programme completion date must be submitted by the implementing entity at least six months prior to the official completion date. This request for extension of the completion date is submitted with delay and not in compliance with the Project/Programme Delay Policy. The implementing entity has faced some implementation challenges due to COVID19 and late processing of budgetary activities which delayed the submission on this request.
- 9. The reason for this second request for extension of the project completion date, as outlined in Annex 1 submitted by ADA, includes the fact that the project is facing delays due to unanticipated procurement challenges related to the last set of activities which involves multiple stakeholders including beneficiaries in remote areas. In addition, the implementing entity has

taken steps to implement activities funded by the project investment income (US\$ 216,964) generated throughout the project duration. To help mitigate these issues and any further risk of delay in the context of the COVID19 pandemic, ADA prepared an updated workplan with detailed timeline (Annex 2).

10. The project also faced several challenges due to the COVID19 which impacted the implementation of multiple activities due to restrictions imposed by the country. Most of the activities planned for year 2020 and 2021 were severally delayed including procurement processes and stakeholders' consultations.

Secretariat's review of the request

- 11. Following a review of the request, the secretariat finds that given the explanation provided by ADA, this request of an eighteen-month extension is justified and will allow the completion of all the remaining activities which are under implementation. It should also be noted that this extension will allow adequate time to complete the learning and reflection processes of the project, and to allow for project reporting and closure processes.
- 12. Finally, the secretariat acknowledges that this no-cost project extension request has been agreed with the Executing Entity and the Designated Authority has been notified, in accordance with the Adaptation Fund Policy for Project/Programme Delays, as specified in Annex 1.

Recommendation

13. Therefore, the Board may consider and decide to approve the request for an eighteenmonth extension of the project completion date from 14 June 2022 to 14 December 2023 for the project "Climate Change Adaptation Project in Oasis Zones (PACC-ZO)" as requested by ADA.

Reasons/justifications for the extension of project/programme completion:

As part of the project's implementation monitoring, we have the honor to highlight the satisfactory rate of implementation and the funds' overall execution rate of 97% which denotes the efforts undertaken and the performances registered on the project implementation, despite the impact of the Covid 19 pandemic.

The impacts of the pandemic on the PACCZO project are closely linked to the nature of some activities which are based on beneficiary and partner groupings. These include thematic conferences, study tours, training workshops, technical seminars, awareness raising workshops, etc.

In this regard, we propose to extend the duration of the project for 18 months, to carry those activities and the ones planned within the last disbursement not received yet (319 318 USD).

The planned activities concern notably:

- The reinforcement of the fight against fires, started within the framework of the AWPB No.4 and having created a strong demand, especially after the outbreak of fires ravaging several palm groves;
- The organization of a seminar for the presentation and dissemination of the project results;
- The conclusion of a partnership agreement with the Regional Chamber of Agriculture of Draa-Tafilalet, for the creation of firefighting water points, within the framework of activity 3.2.4.1 "Setting up water points for firefighting".



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And that to ensure:

- Compliance of project execution with the basic study document;
- Respect for commitments towards beneficiaries and partners;
- A programming of the remainders withdrawn from previous contracts;
- Considering the prevention and fight against fires threatening palm groves.

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Annex 1: Overview of the remaining activities

The progress of project activities has been negatively impacted over the past two years due to the Covid-19 pandemic. With a total of 1.1 million cases, Morocco was the second most affected African country by the pandemic, after South Africa. This has prompted it to take very strict health restrictions, namely general containment, followed by a gradual relaxation throughout the year 2020 and 2021.

1- Impact on the execution of PACCZO project activities:

The impacts of the pandemic on the PACCZO project are closely linked to the nature of some activities which are based on beneficiary and partner groupings. These include thematic conferences, study tours, training workshops, technical seminars, awareness raising workshops, etc. These impacts have also concerned activities not yet started:

• In the case of activities in progress (AWPB No.2 and AWPB No.3):

The activities subject to contracts and purchase orders directly impacted by the pandemic relate to actions initiated (travel, seminar, etc.) within the framework of AWPB No.2 and AWPB No.3:

These contracts, which totaled Dhs 15,136,656 (US\$ 1,570,193), were suspended for periods ranging from 7 to 16 months:

It should be noted that all these activities have been resumed in a staggered manner over time, starting in September 2020, with the exception of:

- The study trip to China; and
- Awareness campaigns in schools, due to the health restrictions taken in schools.

For activities launched in 2020 (AWPB No.4):

The AWPB No.4 experienced difficulties in launching, executing and receiving the services planned for 2020-2021, due to the covid19 pandemic, in particular limiting consultation meetings with the populations for the identification of sites for selected transactions. The launch of these services was scheduled for January 2021 and were actually launched from June 2021, i.e. a delay of 6 months. The planned activities, totaling an amount of 6,600,000 Dhs (684,647 US\$).

Based on the elements presented above, it should be noted that the pandemic has impacted the execution of project activities, which concerns a total amount of 21,736,656 Dhs (2,254,840 \$US), representing 23.6% of the project cost. This rate can be qualified as considerable in relation to the project cost.



2- Other activities to be carried out:

The rest of the activities to be carried out concern:

- For the execution entity (ANDZOA):
- The reinforcement of the fight against fires, started within the framework of the AWPB No.4 and having created a strong demand, especially after the outbreak of fires ravaging several palm groves;
- The organization of a seminar for the presentation and dissemination of the project results;
- The conclusion of a partnership agreement with the Regional Chamber of Agriculture of Draa-Tafilalet, for the creation of firefighting water points, within the framework of activity 3.2.4.1 "Setting up water points for firefighting" for an amount of 1,000,000 dhs.

These activities are scheduled under AWPB No.5 and will be financed by:

- The last payment estimated at 3,186,713.56 Dhs (330 572 SUS (still to be paid);
- The amount of contracts and purchase orders disengaged from previous budgets (1,000,000 dhs; 103 734 \$US)
- For the Implementing Entity (ADA):

These are mainly the following activities:

- The production of an institutional film;
- Completion of the final project evaluation;
- The organization of a closing workshop;
- Capacity building.



Annex 2: Focus on the project progress status

The PACCZO project targets two areas that are particularly vulnerable to climate change: the Intermediate Gheris Basin and the Maïder Basin with different issues that are representative of the area.

Compared to the forecasts, the schedule of ADA payments to ANDZOA was as follows:

Annex 3: Focus on the AWPB No.4 progress status

The activities of the AWPB No.4 have focused on component 3 "improving the resilience of ecosystems in response to climate change and variability", through activities to enhance the oasis heritage, and the protection of it against the phenomena threatening it, namely silting and fires.

These activities were carried out in a partnership framework aimed at complementarity and synergy between ANDZOA and ORMVA of Tafilalet and concern the Tinejdad area. The total cost of AWPB No.4 is six million six hundred thousand Dirhams (6,600,000.00 Dhs) of which (4,100,000 Dhs) as a PACCZO contribution paid to ORMVAT in December 2020.
