**WORK PLAN FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024** 

#### **Background**

- 1. At its thirty-eighth meeting, the Adaptation Fund Board (the Board) approved the work plan for the fiscal year 2023 (FY22: 1 July 2022 30 June 2023). The present document summarizes the actions and decisions taken by the Board in the period from 1 July 2022 to the date of issuance of this document (the reporting period) in compliance with the approved work plan for FY23. During the period covered, the Board convened at its thirty-ninth meeting, which took place on 11-14 October 2022 in Bonn, Germany. This document presents a proposed work plan for FY24, prepared by the secretariat and in accordance with the mandate that the Board received from the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol (CMP), and from the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement (CMA) and as well as decisions adopted by the Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (COP) and the Board, for consideration by the Ethics and Finance Committee (EFC).
- 2. The work plan for the next fiscal year is generally presented at the last Board meeting of the fiscal year. The proposed work plan for FY24 is therefore being presented to the EFC for recommendation and subsequently to the Board for approval at its fortieth meeting to be held on 23-24 March 2023.

#### Compliance with work plan for FY23

- 3. During FY23 and as of the date of issuance of this document the Board has fulfilled the following functions mandated by the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol (CMP) in decisions 1/CMP.3 and 1/CMP.4:
  - The Board has accredited one Regional Implementing Entity (RIE), which puts the total number of entities accredited to the Fund at 57, comprising of 34 National Implementing Entities (NIEs), nine RIEs and 14 Multilateral Implementing Entities (MIEs). The Board also re-accredited one NIE, thereby increasing the number of re-accredited entities in the Fund's portfolio to 34, comprising of 18 NIEs, 5 RIEs, and 11 MIEs.
  - The Board has approved altogether five regular projects/programmes for funding for a total amount of US\$ 47.5 million, which included three single-country projects totalling US\$ 21.5 million and two regional projects totalling US\$ 26 million. The Board has also endorsed ten single-country project concepts. The Board has also approved project formulation grants for regular projects totalling US\$ 199,000. For the Enhanced Direct Access window, the Board at its thirty-ninth meeting approved one for an amount of US\$ 5 million and endorsed one concept note. The Board additionally endorsed two Large Innovation concepts, one single-country and one regional. The total amount of funds disbursed during the reporting period is US\$ 39.8 million including other small grants.
  - One portfolio monitoring mission took place from 21 November to 2 December 2022 to collect and analyse lessons learned and best practices from the regional project

"Integrating Flood and Drought Management and Early Warning for Climate Change Adaptation in the Volta Basin (Benin, Burkina Faso, Côte d'Ivoire, Ghana, Mali, Togo)" implemented by the World Meteorological Organization. A report of the portfolio monitoring mission was developed and is to be added as information document for the 40<sup>th</sup> Board meeting.

- The United Nations Climate Change Conference in Sharm el-Sheikh, Egypt, took place from 6 to 18 November 2022, and COP 27 / CMP 17 / CMA 4 made decisions related to the Adaptation Fund, including: CMP 17 decisions on the fourth review of the Adaptation, the Adaptation Fund Board Report for 2022 and guidance relating to the Clean Development Mechanism; CMA 4 decisions on matters relating to the Adaptation Fund, on rules, modalities and procedures for the mechanism established by Article 6, paragraph 4 of the Paris Agreement, matters relating to the work programme under the framework for non-market approaches referred to in Article 6, paragraph 8 of the Parus Agreement, Sharm el-Shaikh Implementation \_Plan, and matters relating to the Least Developed Countries; and COP 27 decision on joint work on implementation of climate change on agriculture and food security, long term climate finance, matters relating to Standing Committee on Finance. The decisions are elaborated in detail in document AFB/B.40/9 and its Annex.
- The Board welcomed the financial pledges and contributions to the Adaptation Fund made by the Governments of Austria, Canada, France, Germany, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Japan, Republic of Korea, New Zealand, Norway, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Portugal, Switzerland, the United States of America, Walloon Regional Government of Belgium, Quebec, Canada, and UNFCCC (from its CDM Trust Fund as authorized by Parties at CMP16) totalling equivalent to nearly USD 243 million.
- 4. The following actions derived from Board decisions and included in the work plan for FY23 were also completed during the reporting period (from July 2022 to the date of issuance of this document):
  - The Board completed the intersessional review cycle in July 2022.
  - The Board and secretariat completed the first regular project and programme review cycle for decisions for FY23 between August to October 2022. The second review cycle is ongoing from January to March 2023 and the third intersessional review cycle will follow from April to July 2023 (or, as may be amended by the Board following the PPRC consideration of and recommendation on the matter of Options for further supporting the work of the PPRC).
  - The Board and secretariat organized the thirty-ninth meeting of the Adaptation Fund Board on 11-14 October 2022 in Bonn, Germany.
  - The secretariat supported the thirty-eighth and thirty-ninth meetings of the Accreditation Panel which took place on 7-8 September 2022 and 8-9 February 2023 respectively.

- The secretariat issued the annual performance report (APR) for the fiscal year 2022. A
  user-friendly graphic version of the report was produced and translated in French, Spanish
  and Arabic.
- The secretariat held the 2022 annual Climate Finance Readiness Seminar for accredited NIEs of the Fund on 26-30 September 2022 in Washington, D.C., the first Webinar on Gender on 27 October 2022 focusing on the AF gender framework, an updated gender guidance document and best practices, and challenges hindering compliance with AF gender policy, Webinar on Accreditation on 7 December 2022, and the 14<sup>th</sup> Webinar of the Fund's readiness webinar series on 8 December 2022 which focused on distilling the characteristics of Enhanced Direct Access and Innovation Project design in Adaptation.
- The secretariat is planning to hold the 15<sup>th</sup> webinar in the Fund's readiness webinar series in March 2023, a webinar on gender in April, an Enhanced Direct Access Workshop in May, and a Country Exchange in June.
- The Board, during the intersessional period between its thirty-ninth meeting and the fortieth meeting, approved two Readiness Package Grant proposals for two candidate National Implementing Entities requesting accreditation with the Fund.
- The Board, with the support of the secretariat, continued its ongoing discussion on linkages between the Fund and the Green Climate Fund.
- The Board, at thirty-ninth meeting, amended the Fund's Operational Policies and Guidelines for Parties to Access Resources of the Adaptation Fund (OPG) and approved the amendments to the Strategic Priorities, Policies and Guidelines of the Fund (SPPG) in response to decisions 3/CMP.16, paragraphs 6 and 7, and 13/CMA.3, paragraphs 7 and 8. The Board also submitted its recommendation to the CMP, through the addendum to the report of the Board to CMP17 and CMA 4, that the CMP consider and take any action on, as it deems appropriate, the amendments to the SPPG as approved by the Board at its thirty-ninth meeting. At Sharm El-Sheikh Climate Change Conference in November 2022, the CMP 17 noted with appreciation the work of the Board on adopting the amended OPG and welcomed the amended SPPG.1 In addition, the CMA at its fourth session (CMA 4) noted with appreciation the work of the Board on adopting the amended OPG and welcomed the amended SPPG.2
- As part of the implementation of the Fund's Gender Policy and Action the secretariat carried out the first Fund's webinar dedicated to gender theme targeting its all implementing entities (IEs), with a view to strengthening IE's capacity to apply a gender-responsive approach in the climate adaptation interventions, by such as sharing good practices, tools and insights to better understand and integrate gender considerations in the implementation of the

Fund-supported projects and programmes. The secretariat also continued expanding its gender partnership and collaboration with other partner organizations on promoting gender equality and empowerment of women and girls while sharing Fund's experiences and lessons learned and advocating the gender work of the Fund in a number of gender events such as the events titled, "Local perspectives to make gender-just climate finance a reality" organized by the Global Alliance for Green and Gender Action, the event titled "Climate finance, gender and conflict – towards financing for sustaining peace and women's empowerment" organized by UNDP on the margins of the COP27, as well as the event titled "LIVE TALK 04: Gender-smart climate and disaster risk investing and grant making: From principles to practice" organized by InsuResilience Centre of Excellence on Gender-Smart Solutions.

- Following the adoption of the new Medium Term Strategy (2023 to 2027) (Board decision B.39/61), the secretariat organized a side event at COP27 to launch the new MTS, produced a reader-friendly version for publication on the AF website and broad dissemination with stakeholders, and prepared a draft implementation plan under the guidance of the Board's MTS task force for consideration by the Board at its fortieth meeting.
- The secretariat prepared a draft resource mobilization strategy and action plan that was considered and approved by the Board at its thirty-ninth meeting.
- The secretariat published several knowledge products to date: (i) Youth Engagement in Climate Change Adaptation: Lessons from the Adaptation Fund Portfolio of Projects and Programmes (July 2022), (ii) Lessons learned: Adaptation Fund's Streamlined Accreditation Process (August 2022), (iii) Scaling up adaptation finance: Experiences and lessons learned from the Adaptation Fund portfolio of projects and programmes (October 2022), (iv) Lessons learned from the Adaptation Fund Experience in Strengthening Longterm Resilience Through Food Security (December 2022).

#### Proposal of work plan for FY24

5. Based on the above, the secretariat presents to the EFC the secretariat proposed workplan for FY24. The routine activities of the Board are not included in the workplan. Other actions can be added as a result of the decisions adopted by the Board at this meeting.

#### Recommendation

- 6. The EFC may wish to consider and recommend that the Board:
