## **Adaptation Futures 2023 Side Event**

Empowering the most vulnerable, women, youth, elderly, indigenous populations, and incorporating local and traditional knowledge

Friday, October 6, 2023 | Montreal, Canada 8:30-10:00AM EDT (UTC-4)

During this session Adaptation Fund (AF), National Implementing Entities (NIEs), NGO representatives and AFCIA (Adaptation Fund Climate Innovation Accelerator) grantees will discuss lessons learned from projects and programs that benefit and empower the most vulnerable communities such as women, youth, the elderly, and indigenous populations, and incorporate local and traditional knowledge.

## Overview:

The session will be moderated by the AF secretariat who will set the stage from a knowledge and learning perspective and link it to climate adaptation. This will be followed by 3 NIE representatives, an NGO representative and an AFCIA grantee who will have the opportunity to speak about the importance of incorporating the knowledge of local actors in climate adaptation interventions from their own country perspectives and from their experiences of implementing AF-funded projects.



The session will conclude with a broader discussion in the end, reaching back to the key questions and shared experiences from the start of the session, with the aim to reflect on the presentations and get thoughts and questions from the audience.
