Background: During the intersessional review period between the fortieth and forty-first meeting of the board, the secretariat processed and reviewed one readiness package grant that has been approved by the Board through decision B.40-41/12).

## 9. Review of the Proposals to coordinate the Adaptation Fund Climate Innovation Accelerator (AFCIA) partnership.

Background: There are currently three Adaptation Fund Climate Innovation Accelerator small grants programme proposals and three Coordination Mechanism proposals for AFCIA that have been processed and technically reviewed by the secretariat.

Action expected: The PPRC will be invited to take note of the report on the initial review of the proposal contained in document AFB/PPRC.32/18 and to make a recommendation to the Board if necessary.

### 10. Full cost of adaptation reasoning.

Document: AFB/PPRC.32/21, Guidance on optional co-financing in the context of the Adaptation Fund based on the current interpretation of the full cost of adaptation.

Background: The Adaptation Fund Board, through Decision B.38/40, requested the secretariat to develop, through a consultative process, guidance on optional co-financing based on the current interpretation of the

full cost of adaptation which; defines the scope and parameters for Adaptation Fund co-financing; identifies the suite of financial instruments that can be utilized; outlines pathways to address potential risks and to present the draft guidance for the consideration of the PPRC at its thirty-first meeting. Action expected: The PPRC will be invited to take note of the Guidance on optional co-financing in the context of the adaptation fund based on the current interpretation of the full cost of adaptation, AFB/PPRC.32/21, and to make a recommendation to the Board.

### 11. Proposed adjustments to implementation fees and execution costs.

Document: AFB/PPRC.32/22, Proposed adjustments to implementation fees and execution costs.

Background: The Adaptation Fund Board, through Decision B.39/3, requested the secretariat to consider the existing policies on implementation fees and execution costs for all financing widows, including on their use, and propose adjustments with a view to simplifying and harmonizing them, and present a recommendation on the matter to the Project and Programme Review Committee at its thirty-second meeting.

Action expected: The PPRC will be invited to take note on the proposed adjustments to implementation fees and execution costs, AFB/PPRC.32/22, and to make a recommendation to the Board.

## 12. Rolling-basis submissions: Progress report on the implementation of the pilot and proposals for updating Fund policies.

Document: AFB/PPRC.32/23, Progress report on the implementation of the pilot rolling basis submission process and proposals for updating the operational policies and guidelines for parties to access resources from the Adaptation Fund.

Background: The Adaptation Fund Board, through Decision B.40/59, requested the secretariat to prepare a progress report on the implementation of the pilot rolling-basis submission process with further recommendations for improvement, as appropriate; to develop proposals for updating the Operational Policies and Guidelines for Parties to Access Resources from the Adaptation Fund, and to present these documents to the Project and Programme Review Committee at its thirty-second meeting.

Action expected: The PPRC will be invited to take note on the report on the implementation of the pilot rolling basis submission process and proposals for

updating the operational policies and guidelines, AFB/PPRC.32/23, and to make a recommendation to the Board.

### 13. Terms of reference for the establishment of the Adaptation Fund Technical Advisory Body on innovation.

Document: AFB/PPRC.32/24, Terms of reference for the establishment of the Adaptation Fund Technical Advisory Body on innovation.

Background: The Adaptation Fund Board, through Decision B.40/62, requested the secretariat, in consultation with the Innovation Task Force, finalize the draft of the terms of reference for the advisory body for innovation referred to in document AFB/B.39/10, taking into account the developments with the Adaptation Fund's medium-term strategy (2023–2027) and its implementation plan and requested the secretariat to present the finalized draft of the terms of reference for Board's decision at its forty-first meeting or intersessionally.

Action expected: The PPRC will be invited to take note on the terms of reference for the establishment of the Adaptation Fund Technical Advisory Body on innovation, AFB/PPRC.32/24, and to make a recommendation to the Board.

### 14. Post approval project revisions.

Background: The Adaptation Fund Board Secretariat, received intersessionally three requests for no-cost extensions of the project's completion date. All these extensions are necessary to allow sufficient time to complete remaining project activities or to undertake final reports. Similarly, one request for the provision of direct project services (DPS) and minor revisions of the project implementation arrangements for the regional project in Colombia, Ecuador, implemented by the United Nations World Food Programme was received. The request for DPS provision by WFP was requested by the Executing Entities to expedite the project's implementation. Provisions on the approval of DPS are contained in the OPG Annex 7.

Action expected: The PPRC will be invited to take note of the secretariat's assessments contained in documents AFB/PPRC.32/25, AFB/PPRC.32/26, AFB/PPRC.32/27, AFB/PPRC.32/28 and AFB/PPRC.32/29 and to make recommendations to the Board.
